It has been another busy and rewarding year for us at Calcutta Connect. We continued working closely with our local partner, Panikhali Rural Development Society (PRDS), in India, to support their mission to uplift the communities where they operate. Back home in Ireland, we focused on raising essential funds and awareness to ensure we can sustain and expand this support in the future.

During the year, the number of programme participants engaging with PRDS surpassed 1,300 for the first time — the highest to date. This milestone reflects the hard work and dedication of PRDS staff, whose commitment enables children and young people to benefit from a wide range of education and livelihood programmes.

In 2025, we proudly marked 15 years since the founding of Calcutta Connect. It was inspiring to see more supporters join us as monthly donors during this milestone year, strengthening ongoing support for our work on the ground. We look forward to celebrating this anniversary formally next year.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to everyone who supported us throughout 2025. Your generosity and belief in our cause continue to create a lasting impact on the communities we serve through our partnership with PRDS.

PROGRAMME SPOTLIGHT

Sanitary Pad Group

Puja and Amrita are the leaders of the Sanitary Pad Programme that we support in collaboration with PRDS.

The programme aims to address period poverty in communities where we work with PRDS. By providing pads, they address the menstrual hygiene challenges faced by women and girls in the community, improving their health, education, and well-being.

Puja and Amrita lead the team that manufactures and sells pads in local communities. They provide sanitary pads free of charge to all girls at PRDS's centres, aiming to reduce absenteeism and empower young women.

We are delighted to see the impact the programme has had to date, and we look forward to seeing its continued growth and even greater impact in the future.



ST COLMCILLE'S COMMUNITY SCHOOL INDIA IMMERSION TRIP

In February, we were delighted to welcome a group of students and staff from St. Colmcille's Community School, who spent a week visiting our partner organisation, Panikhali Rural Development Society (PRDS). During their time at the centres, the group engaged with students and teachers through games, cultural exchange, and learning activities, fostering a fun, shared atmosphere.

Their visit had a lasting impact on the centres, helping build students' confidence and fostering learning through interaction. It was wonderful to see the group fully immerse themselves in village life, form new friendships, and contribute positively throughout their stay.

We are grateful for their enthusiasm and support, and we look forward to welcoming future groups who wish to engage with PRDS and learn more about the work on the ground.







STUDENT CASE STUDY: SANCHAYITA SARDAR

Sanchayita is a Class 11 student at Panikhali Centre. She has been studying there for eight years, having joined in Class 5.

Her mother is a housewife, while her father works in agriculture. Due to the seasonal nature of farming, her father migrates to South India for six months each year to find work.

Her mother suffers from a long-term illness, so Sanchayita takes on extra responsibilities at home, including caring for her two younger sisters. Despite her family's difficulties, she remains committed to completing her education.

I want to support other students like I was supported.

The support she has received from PRDS, including free tuition from Class 5 onwards, sponsorship from Class 9 onwards, and access to a library of guidebooks, has been vital to her continued studies.

She will take her final school exams next year and then plans to pursue a Bachelor's degree in Bengali at college.



STUDENT CASE STUDY: BIKRAM NASKAR

Bikram Naskar, 21, is a former student of the PRDS Boria Centre and is now pursuing a degree in Political Science. He joined the centre in 2017 at the age of 13 while in Class 6.

Bikram's mother is a homemaker, and his father works seasonally in agriculture, migrating for much of the year to different parts of India. With his father as the sole breadwinner, the family often struggled to cover educational expenses.

Bikram credits the PRDS Boria Centre with helping him stay in school. The free coaching and sponsorship support he received from Classes 9 to 12 were vital to completing his studies.

Without PRDS's support, I would not have completed my studies.

Bikram maintains strong ties with the Boria Centre and regularly returns to support students preparing for their board exams. He hopes his example inspires younger students to remain in school and pursue their goals.



TEACHER CASE STUDY: SANJUDA BAIDY MOLLA

Sunjuda, known as Sanju, is the longest-serving teacher at PRDS. She joined shortly after the organisation began in 2007 and now teaches Bengali at the Panikhali Centre.

A resident of Panikhali Village, Sanju has seen firsthand the impact PRDS has had on the community. Over the years, she has watched many students complete their education, attend college, and secure employment, becoming confident and responsible members of society.

Sanju values her work with PRDS and the visible difference the organisation continues to make in the lives of young people. She has observed a significant shift in community attitudes toward education, influenced in part by regular home visits and community events led by PRDS teachers.

She hopes PRDS will continue to strengthen its impact in the years ahead, particularly by supporting girls to complete their education and by reducing the risk of early marriage.



TEACHER CASE STUDY: BIMAN SARDAR

Biman is a maths and geography teacher at the PRDS Boria Centre. He joined PRDS in 2020 and teaches students in Classes 5 to 8 each evening at the centre.


He feels proud to work with PRDS, an organisation that provides free education to children and young people from families in need. Biman believes PRDS offers more than academics and makes a genuine difference to those who require support the most.

He has seen the impact of quality infrastructure and dedicated subject teachers on student outcomes. In the Boria community, he has observed fewer dropouts and more students completing their education since the centre began operating.

During the COVID-19 pandemic and Cyclone Amphan, Biman took pride in PRDS's support for the community during challenging times.

Looking ahead, Biman hopes PRDS will continue strengthening its support for students as they prepare for their board exams and pursue further studies. He also recognises the growing importance of technology and encourages students to build their computer skills and knowledge of emerging technologies.
